Advertising Opportunities

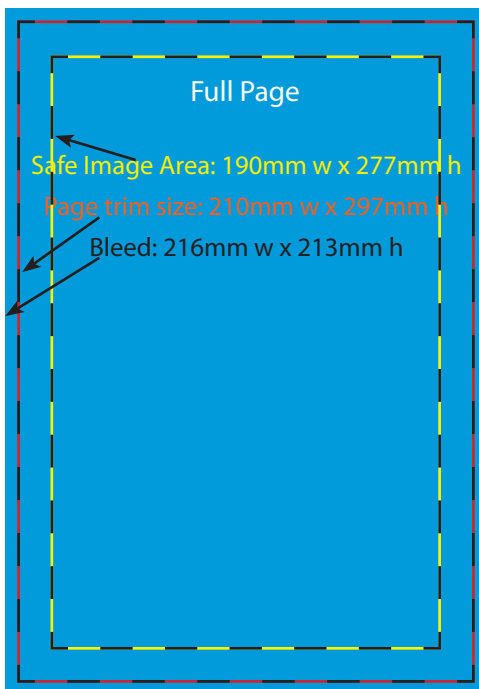
Four sizes of advertisement are available: Full page, half page and two types of quarter page (horizontal or vertical). You should supply quarter page ads in both orientations to allow for adjustment in the event of unequal applications.

Specifications

Advertisements should be supplied as high resolution 300dpi PDF with a CMYK profile. All fonts should be embedded.

Dimensions are shown in the diagrams. Full page only requires bleed (6mm). All other sizes have a white surround.

Quarter page ads can be supplied in a horizontal or vertical orientation (but we suggest you supply in both).

Artwork Submission

In the first instance, advise your ad size and, if applicable, preferred placement to conference@submarineinstitute.com.

Once the size and placement availability has been confirmed, submit your artwork via email (if smaller than 5MB) or via <http://www.hightail.com> for larger files. This free service can be used for files up to 100MB. Zip multiple files into one. Artwork can also be sent by mail on a USB Flash Drive.

Closing date for lodgement is **12 October 2018**.
